The convention’s keynote speaker will be TCCTA executive director Charles Burnside. He was born in Lufkin, Texas, but grew up in the town of Greenville in North Central Texas. He attended public schools there, graduating with honors from Greenville High School.

He received the Associate of Arts degree from The Victoria College and the Bachelor of Arts and Master of Arts degrees from East Texas State University (now Texas A&M University–Commerce). All three degrees were conferred with honors. He completed postgraduate work at Southwest Texas State University and The University of Texas at El Paso.

From 1958 to 1966, he taught high school in the West Texas town of Crane.

In 1966, Mr. Burnside was named administrative assistant, in charge of the Washington office of United States Congressman Richard C. White, Democrat from El Paso.

He returned to Texas—and to teaching—in 1968, joining the social science faculty of Central Texas College, in Killeen.

In 1973, Mr. Burnside was appointed to his present position of Executive Director of the Texas Community College Teachers Association, the largest organization of postsecondary educators in the state, with members from every teaching field and every community and technical college in Texas. He will be retiring from the position the end of March 2001, after a tenure of more than 27 years.

As his proudest achievements, he mentions that he is married to the former Sandra Kay Anderegg (a public school teacher in Austin), and that they are the parents of two grown children—Mary Elisabeth and John Christian.

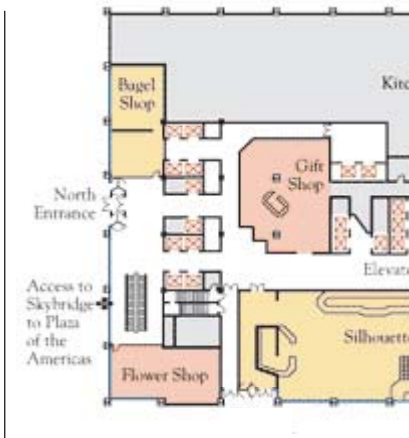

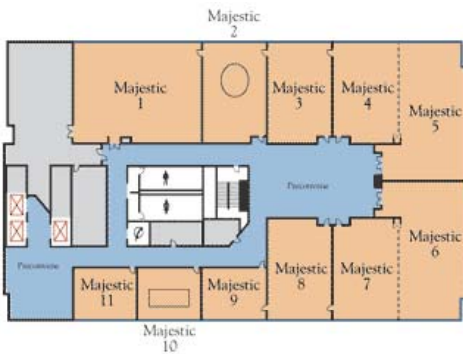

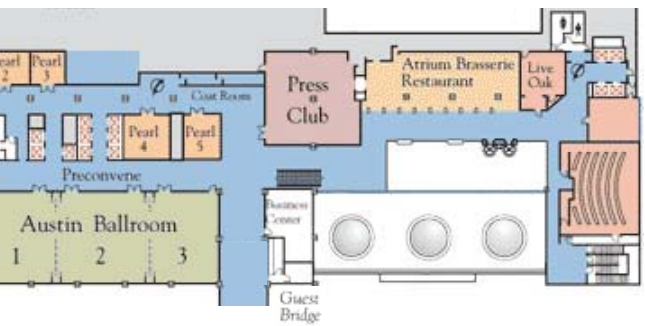
