

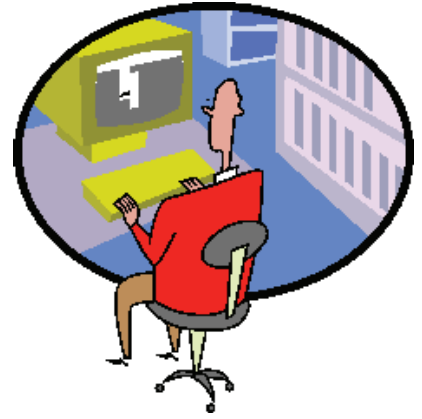

>From Western Texas College there were 11 people in attendance at the webinar on Dual Credit.

At our location the sound was occasionally choppy and the video rarely matched the sound. We lost connection three times during the webinar. This was probably due to challenges with our on-campus bandwidth, but is worth mentioning in case others experienced the same problem.

For this particular webinar on Dual Credit, the program seemed to emphasize dual credit programs in major metropolitan areas. In rural areas the concept of "embedded dual credit" is rarely possible. Most instructors in rural schools do not have the credentials needed to teach college level courses. It would have been nice to see more of the program focused on the many rural schools served by Texas colleges.

Our particular on-campus bandwidth challenges will be remedied this week. We look forward to additional opportunities to participate in TCCTA webinars in the future.
